



English Writing

We will explore 'Where the Wild Things Are' and 'Wild' and write narratives and fact files. We will use suffixes to change the meaning of words. We will continue to think about using conjunctions link our sentences and ideas. We continue to focus on recognising sentences and using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops as well and working on our handwriting.

English Reading

RWinc Phonics and Daily Supported Reading
Children will continue to have daily streamed phonics and reading lessons. Please ensure they are reading for 20 minutes every evening and this is being recorded in their reading records. Children will be reassessed for their levels towards the end of the term.

Science

Animals
We will focus on different types of animals covering birds, fish, mammals, reptiles and amphibians. We will look at habitats, diets and features of these animals.

Religious Education

Christianity : Why might many Christians say that Easter is the most important festival?

Week 1: What happened on Palm Sunday and what does it teach Christians about Jesus?

Week 2: What happened at the Last Supper and what does it teach Christians about Jesus?

Week 3: What happened on Good Friday and what does it teach Christians about Jesus?

Mathematics

Measurement and Numbers to 50

We will review and extend our learning of numbers to 50, understanding that 50 is tens. We will use our number bonds to 10 and related these to numbers to 50. We will use part whole models and number lines as informal methods to help with our addition and subtraction.

We also begin to explore different units of measurement. We will cover length and height as well as volume and capacity.

Music

Composing

The second half of Year 1 focuses on composing music through sound effects and storytelling. This unit corresponds with the curriculum's emphasis on composition and improvisation. Pupils explore creating music that enhances storytelling, building their creative and expressive musical skills. This foundation will be instrumental as they progress to composing more complex pieces in Key Stage 2.

History

Kings, Queens and Leaders

This 'Kings, Queens & Leaders' unit provides the foundation for understanding the changing power of the monarchy in Britain. It will explore how the power that Kings and Queens hold has changed over time, from the all-powerful monarchs who could dictate how the country was run and managed, to the establishment of parliament which created a check on the power of the King or Queen. Understanding this change will create a foundation for children who will go on to understand modern society and politics today.

Computing

Data and Information

Pupils learn about data and information, emphasising labelling, grouping, and searching within data. It shows how computers group and present data efficiently by assigning labels to data, like images.
